Library Report

Turkey Visit – our friend Farmer Mike brought in a live turkey for the kids to see and learn from

Art Reception – "Paper and Ink" a show of current and former SUNY Fredonia Deferment of Visual Arts and New Media opened November 2nd, and ran through the 29th. Exhibit is still currently up due to the weather

Needle Felting – Local artist Emma De La Lane taught a class on the basics of needle felting, and instructed students on how to make a small pair of felted earrings. Very well received, and a second class on how to repair sweaters and other garments will be taught December 14th.

Door Counters — Bullet Aid was approved to put in a new door counter system on all the doors in the building, to better track usage. Current SenSource door counter is over fifteen years old, and has begun to give inaccurate readings. Waiting for more details from Mike Jones at the System for installation and possible state contract discounts for running the wiring or bridging with wi-fi

Exhibits



Prendergast Library Board Bylaws Policy for Removal

f. Removal

Any Trustee may be removed from office with (or without cause) by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all Trustees then in office (or present at meeting), at any regular or special meeting of the Board, if the meeting notice includes such purpose. The Trustee shall be given an opportunity to be heard and the matter considered by the Board at the time and place mentioned in the notice.
