#### **Collections**

- 53 items were catalogued into Past Perfect, and home locations were assigned to 109
- Five SensorPush sensors have been installed in 205 Archives, 204 Storage, Children's Museum, Belden Gallery, and Manley Gallery. This allows for real-time monitoring of temperature and humidity and will alert me to any concerning changes in these areas.
- Canadaway Creek Anthropology Project, Adams Ephemera, and Village Papers Collections are ongoing.

#### **Exhibits**

• I have installed a new archive exhibit in the Belden Gallery, featuring a selection of Fredonia's early settlers. This replaces the display of archival items belonging to the Barker family, which had been on display since 2022.

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#### Curator's Report

#### **Exhibits**

"We are the Champions: A Dynamic Celebration of Athletics in Fredonia" opened to the public on Saturday, November 23rd, and will continue to rotate the featured sports. Current exhibits include mixed martial arts, track and field, dance, football, and baseball; upcoming sports will be aquatic and basketball for winter and spring. Catherine and Katherine are also developing an adapted version of the Chautauqua County Sports Hall of Fame for the hallway between the Steele Room and Library.

#### Outreach

- According to Facebook statistics, the museum's social media page received 7,000 views and content (including photos, posts, etc.) received 16,000 views.
- The museum will welcome two new interns during the Spring semester.
- Lafayette Bicentennial exhibit and programs are being planned; the village has been notified, reenactors are confirmed, and the Grange has been booked for events. NCCF Grant letter of interest due March 1 (?).
