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Archivist's Report

Collections

- 63 items were catalogued into Past Perfect and assigned home locations

- The Canadaway Creek Anthropology Project Collection has been processed, and the finding aid is now available online

- The inventory of File Cabinet #1 in Mintun Room is progressing, with 154 documents assessed so far

- Three new shelves have arrived, they will be used to house our growing collection of historical books

- Our new interns, Krystyna and Jack, are working on inventorying our book collection and on the Village Papers Collection, respectively.

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Curator's Report

Exhibits

- Opened an adapted version of the Chautauqua County Sports Wall of Fame for the hallway between the Steele Room and Library Circulation desk featuring athletes from Fredonia.
- Seats from the Opera House have been acquired and put on display. They date to 1926.

Outreach

- Valentines program, "Victorian Valentines," set for Feb. 14th at 3-5.
- The museum has two interns for the Spring semester, both of whom are Education majors and Museum Studies minors. Both are working in collections cataloging and developing educational programs.
- Lafayette Bicentennial planning continues for May and June Jubilee. The event is being coordinated with DAR, Boys and Girls Club, Masons, SAR, and other county history museums and will promote local history through a special exhibition, lectures, reenactments, musical and dance performances. NCCF Grant letter of interest due March 1. Total budget is currently \$660.
- Fredonia Seed Co. display is now up in the Library coinciding with the Seed Sowing Swap & Workshop Feb. 15.
